# CHRISTIAN SISTERS NEWS

This month's "From the Pastor...." Is a repeat article from August 2022.

My article this month is a return back to the subject of the disciples....and what happened to them afterJesus' resurrection and ascension.

Drawing heavily on the work of other scholars, especially Hulitt Gloer...The disciple, Andrew, will be our focus this month.

Andrew is a Greek name (even though he was Jewish) meaning manly.

Andrew has the honor of being the disciple with the title, protokletos — the first called.

Andrew was from the city of Bethsaida, a village on the northern shore of the Sea of Galilee where he and his more famous brother, Peter, ran the family fishing business.

While Andrew might have been Jesus' first disciple, he had been a disciple of somebody else before he committed to Jesus. Scripture notes that Andrew was a disciple of John the Baptist, which meant that he was somebody who longed for the coming of the promised Messiah.

We first meet Andrew as he is experiencing (for the first time) the truth that Jesus is the Messiah he has been praying for. When Andrew understands this truth, the first thing he does is go back to his friends and take them to Jesus. In fact, that seems to be what Andrew is literally always doing every time we see him in the gospels...he is bringing people to Jesus.

I love that about Andrew...but that isn't my favorite thing about him. What I love the most about Andrew is his servant heart. Andrew was willing to serve Christ without attention or fanfare. Andrew's brother, Peter seemed to always want to be out in front....but Andrew was okay serving God in the shadows...when nobody was looking. Most of the gospels list Andrew as "the brother of Simon Peter." But that didn't seem to matter to Andrew...as long as the king and the kingdom were served. Andrew must have understood what Jesus meant when he said, "In my Father's Kingdom, whoever wants to be first must be last and a servant of all."

Hulitt Gloer notes, "Andrew's story is the story of all persons who labor in quiet humility, all of those whose concern is not the accolades of other people but accomplishing the will of God." I like that about Andrew most of all.

According to early Christian tradition, after the ascension of Jesus, Andrew was allotted the ancient territory of Scythia (a region in modern-day Russia). But the Scythians were feared in the ancient world for their fierce barbarity. Josephus (the great Jewish historian) said they were little different from wild beasts. But Andrew persisted...and came to be the patron Saint of Russia.



A late second-century writing tells of Andrew's ministry in Russia and his eventual martyrdom in Greece. The following is a quote finishing the story:

"According to the Acts of Andrew....Andrew was condemned to death by the governor, Aegeates who was enraged at the conversion of his wife. He ordered Andrew to be crucified, but in order to prolong his suffering the governor ordered he be tied to the cross and not nailed (forcing him to die of hunger and thirst). As Andrew approached the cross he prayed, 'Hail precious cross! Thou hast been consecrated by the body of my Lord and adored with his limbs as rich jewels. I come to the exulting and glad. Receive me with joy into thy arms."

If I could take one quality from any disciple that I thought was most like Jesus....it would be Andrew and his servant heart. It reminds me of the old song that we sing but don't really mean:

Make me a servant, humble and meek. Lord let me lift up those who are weak. And may the prayer of my heart always be...Make me a servant, Lord make me a servant today.


