From the Pastor:

A Grief Journey

As you can probably imagine, the Herridge family has been dealing with an overwhelming amount of grief since Grant's tragic passing. For most of my bereavement leave, I was too emotional and heartbroken to understand and study my grief. But, since it seems as if Grief is going to taking up long-term residence in my heart, I figure I better get to know this deep dark ocean.

Before Grant, I thought I understood grief...I thought my occupation had exposed me to the pain of grief and I thought I had experienced enough deep grief to understand its power (the death of both my parents, with my dad dying on hospice in our home, was really hard). All that to say — I was wrong.

Until Grant, I had not experienced severe grief...and I was not prepared to handle it...but, then again, who is? Nobody is prepared to handle the loss of a person who you know you physically cannot live without...

After Grant, I realized that a lot of my Grief was love with no place left to go. And I knew that I was going to have to dive deep into Grief's darkness in order to find God and happiness again. So that is what I have been doing, recently, in my personal spiritual life. I have been trying to find God in the Grief. Don't worry, though, I am not going to take you with me through that very personal and private journey.

But, I do want to say a word to all of you who have swam in Grief's deep waters...I am swimming there now too. And I hear that Jesus goes there a lot, so that gives me some hope.

While I was swimming in Grief's waters the other day, I came across a "grief truth" that I wanted to share:

Joni Erickson Tada recently wrote a forward in a book about grief and her story struck me:

When a broken neck ambushed my life and left me a quadriplegic, I felt as though God had smashed me underfoot like a cigarette. At night I would thrash my head on the pillow, hoping to break my neck at a higher lever and thereby end my misery.

After I left the hospital, I refused to get out of bed; I told my sister, 'Just close the drapes and turn out the lights.' I had all but died physically, and inside, I wanted to die too.

You don't have to be in a wheelchair to identify. You already know that sad situations sometimes don't get better. Problems don't always get solved. Conflicts don't get fixed. Children die. Couples divorce. Spouses get sick. An untimely death rocks our world and shakes our faith.

We try to manage like jugglers spinning plates on long sticks. When we feel utterly overwhelmed, we try soaking in the tub, sweating on the treadmill, splurging on a new dress or we head to the mountains. We smile and say we are trusting God, but deep down we know that is a lie. We are only trusting that he doesn't load us up with more heartbreak and grief.

That is how I felt. But after weeks in bed, I got tired of being depressed and I finally cried out, 'God if I can't die, please show me how to live." It was just the prayer God was waiting for.

I have prayed a similar version of that prayer, since Grant...But my prayer was a bit different, it was more like — "God how do I live with this ocean of grief in my life?"

Obviously, I am still working that out...but I am happy to announce that God is revealing himself to me as I swim through this ocean. I am finding him more and more in the deep waters of my grief...which I did not expect.

I am not sure why I didn't expect God to show up in my grief. I think because the grief seems so dark...it isn't something I associate with God. But, thankfully, scripture re-set my view on Grief....especially, the Old Testament.

Did you know that God tells us to lay out or grief on him? In fact, he commands us to wail and mourn with him...in his presence. There is even an entire book focused on lament and grief — Lamentations.

So...that is the truth that I will begin my spiritual study/journey through grief. God wants me to cry out in my grief, to him. So...that is what I am going to do.

If you are swimming in grief's waters, like me, and searching for the divine to meet you in your grief...then, I wish you Godspeed. I will keep you posted, from time to time, on my journey.

And while I will spare you the personal specifics of my journey, I will tell you about the road that I am taking...I am starting with scripture (Lamentations, specifically)...but I am also reading the following: A Lament for a Son. Dark Clouds, Deep Mercy. A Grief Observed. And, Can You Drink the Cup by Henri Nouwen.

If you are dealing with deep grief, feel free to journey with me....I can't promise laughter and light-heartedness, but I can promise you will find God.

I hope each of you have a great September....I will see you at Church...It is shaping up to be a great month....See you soon!

November – Books of the Bible Class




